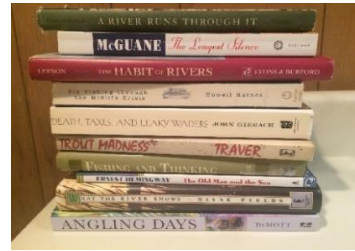


# Stories from the Stream

## The Literature of Fly Fishing

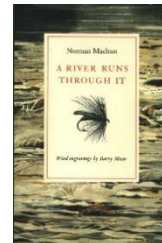


If you enjoy all things fly fishing, on and off the stream, Westover Farms invites you to be part of our new education program, *Stories from the Stream*.

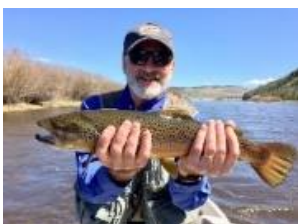
